Comelec: Party-lists allowed to run in 2025 polls out next week

MANILA – The Commission on Elections (Comelec) is looking to release by next week the names of party-list organizations that would be allowed to participate in the May 2025 polls.

Comelec chairperson George Erwin Garcia said Friday that all pending cases need to be resolved first before the poll body can release the list.

"Once we are able to resolve everything by Monday, we can release the list by Friday next week at the most," he said in a radio interview.

Garcia noted that the petitions for accreditation are being resolved based on merits.

Based on the calendar of activities for the May 2025

polls, the period for the filing of List of Nominees and Certificate of Nomination and Certificate of Acceptance of Nomination (CON-CAN) will be on Oct. 1 to 8.

All applications undergo stringent screening process, Garcia said, in response to allegations that those giving bribes or using "connections" are the only ones getting the approval.

"Under our leadership, we use a strict method of screening and decision-making. We have made it a point to do the screening stringently," Garcia added.

A total of 177 party-list organizations sought seats during the May 2022 elections. (PNA)

PHILHEALTH REGIONAL OFFICE IV-A HOLDS PRESS CONFERENCE TO HIGHLIGHT NEW BENEFITS AND COMBAT FRAUD

PhilHealth Regional Office IV-A held a press conference today September 20, 2024 at the Strike Multi-Purpose Hall to inform the public about new benefits available through the program, including the PhilHealth Konsulta Package, and to raise awareness about health insurance fraud. The event was organized by PhilHealth and attended by key figures including Mayor Strike B. Revilla, Mr. Edwin M. Orina, MD - Acting Regional Vice President, Mr. Arturo C. Ardiente - Field Operations Division Chief, Ms. Maria Theresa G. Liwanag, MD OIC Health Care Delivery Management Division, Mr. Benjamin A. Rodil Jr.- Head Local Health Insurance Office Trece Martirez City, and Ms. Darlene Albano -Social Insurance Officer II, LHIO Dasmariñas City. The conference also saw participation from PhilHealth staff and various media outlets.

The main purpose of the press conference was to disseminate information about the new PhilHealth Konsulta Package, which provides access to essential healthcare services like consultations, health screenings, laboratory tests, and medications. The event also aimed to educate the public about the dangers of health insurance fraud and how to identify and report suspicious activities. The press conference served as a valuable platform for PhilHealth to engage with the community and ensure that Filipinos are aware of the benefits and resources available to them. First-time job hunters urged to avail of free pre-employment docs

MANILA – The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) reminded first-time jobseekers to avail of the free pre-employment documents for their applications.

The measure is pursuant to Republic Act 11261 or the First Time Jobseekers Assistance Act, DOLE said in a social media post on Friday.

To avail of the benefit, a barangay certification must be secured, stating that the applicant is a first-time jobseeker and has been a resident for at least six months.

The certification will be presented to the concerned government agencies where the pre-employment documents will be obtained.

The applicant must then re-

port back to the barangay.

The pre-employment documents include barangay certification and clearance for first-time jobseekers, police clearance (local or national); National Bureau of Investigation clearance; medical certificate from public hospitals; birth and marriage certificates; transcript of records, certificate of graduation/completion and diploma from state colleges and universities, as well as local colleges and universities; tax identification number and Philippine Health Insurance Corporation identification cards; Civil Service certificate of eligibility; Department of Migrant Workers certificates; mayor's clearance; Maritime Industry Authority certificates; and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority national certificates and cer-

tificates of competencies.

Excluded in the coverage are applications for a professional licensure exam, Philippine passport authentication and apostille, Career Service Examination and driver's license; and laboratory tests and procedures needed to acquire a medical certificate.

"This is expected to reduce the financial burden of first-time jobseekers," the DOLE said.

The July 2024 Labor Force Survey reported that youth unemployment (ages 15 to 24) accounted for 43 percent of total jobless individuals.

They are mostly those who graduated from college or senior high school and have just entered the labor force. (PNA)

PhilHealth: P654-M benefits distributed to cancer patients

MANILA – The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) has distributed PHP654,000,000 worth of benefits to cancer patients so far.

PhilHealth Quality Assurance Group Vice President Francisco Soria Jr. said Friday the amount has served 7,475 patients based on claims filed since 2012.

While the exact cost of treatment varies according to the type of cancer, Soria said the PhilHealth offers Z benefit packages for cancer care treatment.

"In the case of breast cancer, merong hormone therapy, tapos kailangan din ng surveillance sa kanila (then surveillance is also needed for them). So for example, targeted therapy for breast cancer,

it costs one million pesos," he said during a media forum in Quezon City.

In May, PhilHealth has increased its package for breast cancer patients to PHP1.4 million for stages 0 to 4 of the disease.

It covers the different components of breast cancer management: diagnosis up to PHP14,900; surgery up to PHP140,000; chemotherapy up to PHP198,000 for the whole treatment course; hormone therapy, up to PHP36,000 per year; for targeted therapy PHP1,000,000 per year that constitutes 18 cycles of targeted therapy; and surveillance up to PHP 14,000 per year.

"The good thing about surveillance is that it is good for the whole lifetime of the patient,"



Soria said.

"Maliban diyan meron ho tayong all case rates (ACR) benefits. Kung wala 'yung cancer dun sa anim na may Z benefits, 'yun pong cancer na 'yun ay covered naman ng ACR benefits (Apart from that, we have all case rates benefits. If the cancer is not among the six cancers with Z benefits, it will be covered by ACR)," he added.

reduce the impact that cyberlaws have imposed on a free press," Dayang said in his speech.

Under the administration of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., Dayang discussed the promise of a thriving press despite economic challenges and the rise of social media.

"In the end, we must look up to the reality that journalists, whether classified as reporter, editor or publisher, even if they are branded at times as creepycrawlies, remain as the mouthpiece of democracy and its embodied liberties," he added.

He stressed the need for stronger laws that protect press freedom not just an imperative, but a valuable footstool on which the country can regain the badge of honor as Asia's freest press.

Founded in 1974, PAPI was established by media leaders to address the challenges faced by the media industry during Martial Law.

It also claims being the largest media fraternity in the Philippines, with around 400 community newspaper publishers, media executives, communicators and journalists as members. (PNA)

STRIKE SA KABUHAYAN: EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES THROUGH SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD PROGRAM

The program featured interactive workshops, expert panel discussions, and practical demonstrations, providing participants with a comprehensive understanding of the key elements of successful entrepreneurship. DOST trains 14 Jasaan milk producers on food safety and good manufacturing practices

In its mission to enhance its production standards, the United Livestock Raisers Cooperative (ULIRCO) underwent training on Food Safety and Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP) from the Department of Science and Technology—10 (DOST 10). ULIRCO is a National Dairy Authority-supported group that produces pasteurized milk under the brand name “Fresh Moo” in Jasaan, Misamis Oriental.

Fourteen staff and on-the-job trainees attended the training from DOST 10 on September 10, 2024.

ULIRCO, a recipient of DOST’s Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program (SETUP), had previously benefited from milk processing equipment and

laboratory analysis services provided through the program in 2022. The cooperative also received consultancy support through DOST’s Manufacturing Productivity Extension Program (MPEX).

The cooperative is obtaining the FDA License to Operate (LTO) and Certificate of Product Registration (CPR). These certifications are crucial as they will enable ULIRCO to expand its product range and reach larger markets, including regional mall outlets, thereby increasing its market share and revenue.

ULIRCO’s chairman, Wilfredo Perez, expressed his profound gratitude to DOST for their unwavering technical support. He emphasized that the training was not just a refresher but a crucial step towards securing their FDA LTO, a prerequisite for mar-

ket expansion. Perez also expressed ULIRCO’s eagerness to participate in more DOST programs in the future, recognizing DOST’s pivotal role in their journey.

The session was led by Joannah S. Magto, Senior Science Research Specialist of DOST Misamis Oriental, who addressed the importance of identifying and mitigating food safety hazards, particularly given the perishable nature of milk. Michael Vincent V. Marte, a Professional Food Technologist of DOST Misamis Oriental, followed the discussion on Good Manufacturing Practices, underscoring the role of GMP in ensuring food safety and quality.

With DOST’s Consultancy and Training Services, industries and MSMEs, like ULIRCO, are assisted in improving their compliance with Good Manu-

TUCP to Congress: Pass anti-endo, P150 wage hike bills

MANILA — The Trade Union Congress of the Philippines (TUCP) on Saturday called on Congress to start the deliberations on the measures aimed at ending labor contractualization and implementing a PHP150 across-the-board daily minimum wage hike.

During the Saturday News Forum in Quezon City, TUCP legislative officer Carlo Oñate said the proposals would increase the Philippine workforce productivity, as well as spur economic growth in the country.

“So, ini-expect namin na magkaroon na rin ng hearing sa Senado at simulan na rin sa House of Representatives itong usapin ng endo dahil ito ‘yung pangunahing hindrance doon sa ating mga manggagawa para sila ay mag-organisa para makapag-collective bargaining sila ng mas mataas na sahod (we expect that there will be a hearing in the Senate and the House of Representatives to start this discussion on endo because this is the main hindrance to our workers to organize the collective bargaining for a higher wage),” Oñate said.

Endo, a term for end of contract, is a form of contractualization that involves companies giving workers temporary employment that lasts them less than six months and then terminating their employment just short of being regularized.

The proposed Security of Tenure Act, which aims to end the practice of labor contractualization in the country, was vetoed by former president Rodrigo Duterte in July 2019 following opposition from labor groups.

The labor leader also urged Congress to pass the measure that implements an across-the-board wage increase of PHP150.

He said raising wages would increase workers’ productivity, thus paving the way for more profit for investors.

“In fact, dahil nagtaas ka ng sahod, tataas ‘yung productivity noong ating mga manggagawa, tataas ‘yung profit ng ating mga enterprises. At ‘yung ibibigay naman nating dagdag-sahod na PHP150,

hindi naman natin itatagolang ‘yun sa ilalim ng kama. Ipangagastos din ‘yun ng ating mga manggagawa na siyang magpapasigla ng ating ekonomiya (when you raise wages, the productivity of our workers will increase, the profit of our enterprises will increase. And the PHP150 extra wage will not be kept under the bed. Our workers will also spend that, which will stimulate our economy),” he added.

The proposal granting a PHP150 increase in the daily minimum wage of employees in the private sector is pending in the House of Representatives.

The Senate in February this year already passed its version of the bill that seeks PHP100 daily wage hike for private workers.

Oñate expressed optimism that the Lower House would pass the wage hike proposal, considering that lawmakers have already heard the concerns of and inputs from stakeholders during the previous three congressional hearings.

“No less than si Speaker Martin Romualdez ang nagsabi na ‘yung bill ay hindi pa patay. Ganoon din ‘yung sinabi ni Committee on Labor chair Congressman Fidel Nograles na hindi pa patay iyong bill. In fact, nakatatlong hearing na kami sa Committee on Labor and Employment (No less than Speaker Martin Romualdez said that the bill is not yet dead. Committee on Labor Chairman Congressman Fidel Nograles also said that the bill is not dead. In fact, we have had three hearings at the Committee on Labor and Employment),” he said.

“Ang pinapanawagan lang namin ngayon, ipatawag na ‘yung pang-apat na hearing upang finally pagbotohan na itong PHP150 legislated wage increase ng TUCP (The only thing we are calling for now is to call the fourth hearing so that the TUCP’s PHP150 legislated wage increase can finally be voted on),” Oñate added. (PNA)

‘Habagat’ to continue to drench Luzon, Visayas as ‘Igme’ exits PAR

MANILA – Tropical Depression Igme is now out of the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) but the southwest monsoon or “habagat” affecting Luzon and the Visayas will continue to bring rains over a large part of the country, the weather bureau said Saturday.

As of 3 a.m., Igme was located 515 km. northeast of Itbayat, Batanes, packing maximum winds of 55 kph near the center with gustiness of up to 70 kph, and moving northwestward at 35 kph.

Meanwhile, Batanes and the Babuyan Islands will experience monsoon rains, while the Ilocos Region, Zambales, and Bataan will have occasional rains due to the southwest monsoon, according to the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA).

Metro Manila, the rest of Luzon, Western Visayas, Northern



Samar, Eastern Samar, and Samar will have cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms.

Mindanao and the rest of the Visayas will experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies

with isolated rain showers or thunderstorms, PAGASA said.

Strong winds and rough seas will be felt over the western and northern sections of Northern Luzon, while the rest of Luzon will experience moderate to

strong winds and moderate to rough seas.

The rest of the archipelago will experience light to moderate winds and light to moderate seas. (PNA)

Gov't begins preparations for mandatory speed limiters in PUVs

MANILA – Ranking transportation officials have started drafting the guidelines to enforce mandatory speed limiters in public utility vehicles (PUVs).

In a statement Friday, Land Transportation Office (LTO) chief, Assistant Secretary Vigor Mendoza II said Republic Act 10916, or the Road Speed Limiter Act was supposed to be fully implemented in 2016 after it lapsed into law.

"The full implementation of this law is long overdue. We have to do something now for

the interest and protection of all road users," Mendoza said.

He said a meeting was first held Wednesday among officials of the Department of Transportation (DOT), the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board, and the LTO.

"We will continue holding a series of meetings in order to come up with the guideline, with the intention of installing the required speed limiters in the soonest possible time," Mendoza said.

During the meeting, UV Ex-

press and bus operators were also convened for a dialogue on the mandatory implementation of speed limiters.

"These measures aim to promote safer travel for commuters and elevate the standards of public transportation safety across the country," he said.

The Republic Act 10916 introduces the use of a speed limiter device which electronically controls the speed of a vehicle without affecting the vehicle components.

The law was enacted as part of the government intervention in road accidents. (PNA)

Fisher missing for a month rescued off Batanes waters

MANILA – The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) rescued a fisher reported missing for more than a month off the waters of Basco, Batanes on Thursday.

Robin Dejillo, 49, of Barangay Dinahican, Infanta, Quezon, was sighted on board his white motorbanca by a Coast Guard Station Batanes patrol team.


He was reported missing on

Aug. 4.

Dejillo said he failed to return to their mother boat after his motorized boat ran out of gas.

He said he survived at sea by drinking rainwater and eating fish and coconuts he found floating.

He was taken to the Batanes General Hospital for treatment. (PNA)

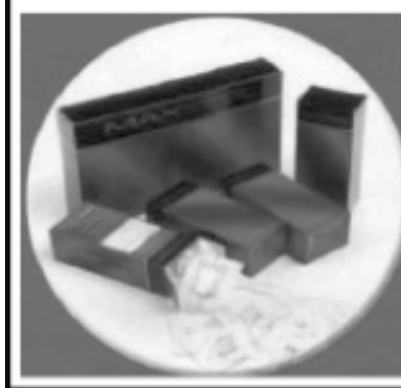
