

Gov't aid sent to 4K families affected by Crising, habagat in Calabarzonby 'Crising'

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) in Calabarzon has sent aid to more than 4,000 families

affected by the combined effects of Severe Tropical Storm Crising and the southwest monsoon or habagat.

In a social media post on Tuesday, July 22, the DSWD Calabarzon said it

has provided over ₱1.29 million-worth of food and non-food items to a total of 4,570 families across the re-

gion affected by continuous heavy rains. The majority of those affected are from Rizal province, with 2,118 families

currently taking shelter in 45 evacuation centers.

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) – The provincial government has placed Cavite under a state of calamity on Tuesday, July 22 to hasten government aid for residents affected by Severe Tropical Storm Crising and the southwest monsoon (habagat).

Governor Francisco Gabriel Remulla signed a resolution for the declaration amid the rising number of residents affected by flooding due to continuous heavy rains.

In a statement, Remulla said the state of calamity will allow the provincial government to use its calamity and quick response funds for relief operations.

DSWD assists 1.8M individuals in crisis situations across Calabarzon

Over 1.8 million Calabarzon residents have received financial aid from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) since 2024 under its Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS).

The program aligns with the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to ensure the swift and efficient delivery of aid, reaffirming the “Bawat Buhay Mahalaga” vision of Bagong Pilipinas.

According to DSWD Calabarzon, a total of 1,833,996 individuals have been provided with financial support since 2024 to help them cope with various economic shocks such as illness, hospitalization, or the death of a family member. Of this number, 587,000 individuals were assisted in the first half of 2025.

“If there’s death in the family or hospitalization, you can’t prepare for it, so we are helping them get back on track and recover. With the assistance that we give, it will help them be productive, start anew, and provide again for their needs,” said Regional Director Barry Chua of DSWD Calabarzon.

DSWD emphasized that the provision of financial assistance under the program is based on the assessment and interview conducted by social workers, as well as the status of the clients.



According to DSWD data in 2024, a total of 1,246,996 individuals were assisted through the AICS program, with a total amount of P5.13 billion disbursed to cover medical, subsistence, burial, and educational needs.

To enhance the efficiency of aid delivery, DSWD partnered with the Land Bank of the Philippines and the Universal Storefront Services Corporation (USSC) to implement hybrid digital payments and streamlined disbursement methods.

“We started the implementation of hybrid digital payment of financial assistance in Batangas City last January 17, 2025, with 577 clients receiving a total of 1.8 million in medical or burial assistance. This is for efficient disbursement and

minimizes security risks for DSWD personnel by handling large amounts of cash during payouts,” Chua explained.

Through guarantee letters (GLs), the AICS program now allows access to medical assistance via selected branches of the leading drugstore chain, Mercury Drug. These GLs ensure that the government covers the cost of products and services, including medicines, provided by partner service providers.

“In Calabarzon there are five participating Mercury Drug outlets accepting guarantee letters, including Bayanan in Bacoor City, P. Guevarra Sta. Cruz in Laguna, Kumintang Ilaya in Batangas City, Cathedral in Antipolo City, and Merchan in

Lucena City.”

One of the AICS beneficiaries, Donna Talucod, 43, a resident of Victoria, Laguna, whose husband is a kidney transplant patient, expressed gratitude to the government for the help provided by the program.

“The assistance I received through GL helped me ease the financial burden on my shoulders, and getting the medicines at the nearest Mercury Drug assured me of quality medicine. This is such a big help,” Talucod said.

Chua reaffirmed DSWD Calabarzon’s commitment to assisting individuals and families through its social protection programs, underscoring the agency’s goal to uplift those in crisis situations. (KA, PIA4A)

More CALABARZON towns under state of calamity



Four more local government units (LGUs) in CALABARZON have been placed under a state of calamity as torrential rains continue from the enhanced Southwest Monsoon or Habagat.

Declared under calamity state are the towns of Agoncillo, Batangas as well as Cainta, Rodriguez, and San Mateo in Rizal Province.

The provincial government of Cavite said it will use its Php 15 million-Quick Response

Fund to ensure aid for displaced families. Provincial officials on Tuesday had placed Cavite under state of calamity.

In Cainta, the Sangguniang Panlungsod approved its Resolution No. 2025-012 to formalize the calamity declaration due to the effects of Severe Tropical Storm Crising and the southwest monsoon. Local authorities have reported that the extreme weather has displaced families and disrupted the delivery of essential services in seven barangays. (PIA4A)

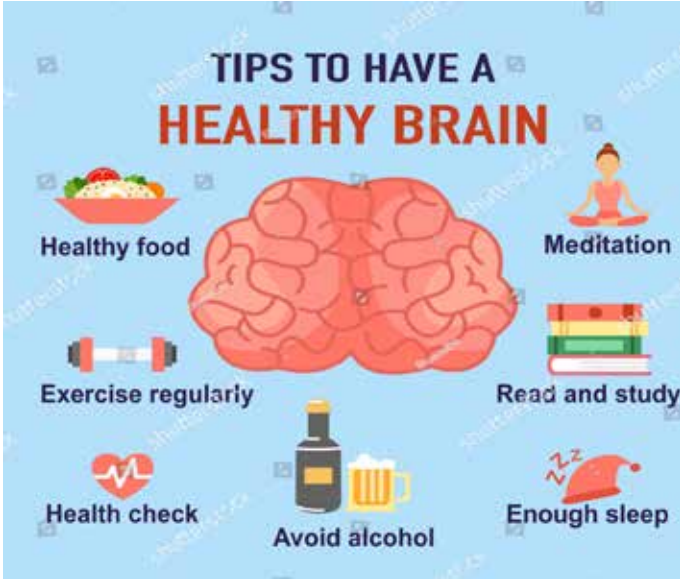

NGCP starts restoration of ‘Emong’-affected transmission lines

MANILA – Restoration on transmission lines affected by Typhoon Emong (international name Co-May) in Northern Luzon has started, the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) said Friday.

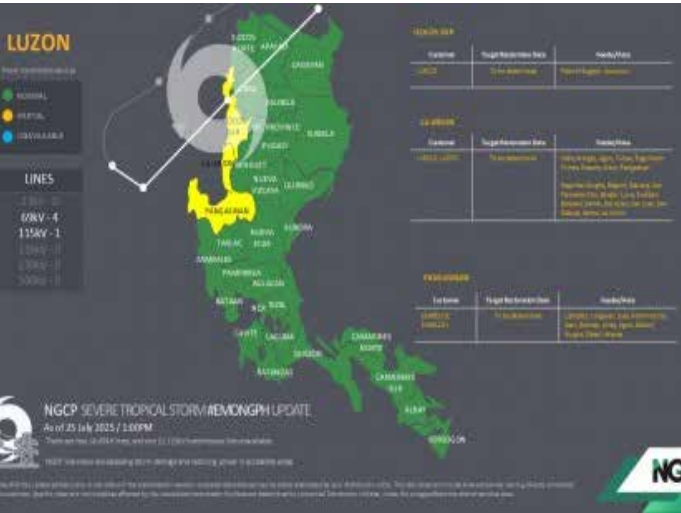
In an advisory, the power transmission operator did not give specifics on what lines are being restored but said its crews are now inspecting and assessing the damage.

As of 1 p.m., the affected lines include the Labrador-Bolinao 69kV Line, which serves the Central Pangasinan Electric Cooperative (CENPELCO) and the Pangasinan 1 Electric Cooperative (PANELCO 1).

Also, the Bauang-San Fabian 69kV Line, the Bauang-Naguilian 69kV Line, the Bauang-San Fernando 115kV Line, and the Bacnotan-Bulala 69kV Line, all of which serve the La Union Electric Cooperative (LUELCO).

“Please note that loss of pow-

er may be caused by affected transmission facilities of NGCP or distribution utilities or electric cooperatives. Specific cities and municipalities affected by the power interruptions are determined by concerned Distribution Utilities, unless the outage affects the entire franchise area,” the advisory said.

The DSWD Calabarzon said it has been monitoring and assessing the situation since the onset of severe weather conditions on Saturday, July 19.

“Since July 19, the DSWD Field Office IV-A, through its Quick Response Teams, has been closely coordinating with local government units (LGUs) to assess the needs of affected families, especially those displaced and currently staying in LGU-run evacuation centers,” the agency said.

Aid were also extended in Laurel and Tanauan City in Batangas; Silang, Magallanes, and Ternate in Cavite; Cabuyao City in Laguna; Pitogo in Quezon; and Rodriguez and Taytay in Rizal.

The agency emphasized that it remains ready to provide appropriate augmentation support to LGUs in need of assistance.

“The DSWD continues to coordinate with all affected LGUs in CALABARZON to determine the needs of affected families and deliver the appropriate assistance.”

Sufficient food and non-food items prepositioned in 69 warehouses across the region are ready for deployment to LGUs requesting support.

In addition to distributing relief goods, DSWD personnel also conduct monitoring and inspections of open evacuation centers in the region to ensure the safety of affected families and to address their immediate needs. (KA, PIA4A)

‘Emong’ continues to weaken; Signal No. 3 still up in N. Luzon

MANILA – Severe Tropical Storm Emong continues to weaken, packing maximum sustained winds of 95 kph near the center, and gustiness of up to 160 kph, the weather bureau said in its 11 a.m. bulletin on Friday.

It was located in the vicinity of Calanasan, Apayao province as of 10 a.m.

Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal No. 3 is still hoisted over the northeastern portion of Ilocos Norte (Bangui, Pagudpud, Dumalneg, Piddig, Vintar, Adams, and Carasi), the northern portion of Apayao (Calanasan and Luna), and the northwestern portion of mainland Cagayan (Santa Praxedes, Claveria, Sanchez-Mira, and Pamplona). Storm-force winds will prevail in these areas.

Gale-force winds will be experienced in areas under Signal No. 2: the rest of Ilocos Norte, the northern portion of Ilocos Sur (Santa, Caoayan, City of Vigan, Bantay, Santa Catalina, San Vicente, Santo Domingo, San Ildefonso, Magsingal, San Juan, Cabugao, and Sinit), the rest of Apayao, the northern portion of Abra (Pidigan, San Juan, Tayum, Langiden, Sallapadan, Lagangilang, Danglas, La Paz, Licuan-Baay, Tineg, Malibcong, Peñarrubia, San Isidro, San Quintin, Dolores, Lagayan, Bangued, Bucay, and Lacub), Batanes, and the northern and western portion of mainland Cagayan (Piat, Camalaniugan, Tuao, Buguey, Aparri, Allacapan, Rizal, Lasam, Ballesteros, Abulug, and Santo Niño).

Areas under Signal No. 1 will experience strong winds: the rest of Ilocos Sur, the northern portion of La Union (Luna, Santol, City of San Fernando, San Juan, Bagulin, Bangar, San Gabriel, Bacnotan, Sudipen, and Balaoan), the rest of Abra, the northern portion of Benguet (Mankayan, Kapangan, Atok, Kabayan, Kibungan, Bakun, and Buguias), Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, the rest of mainland Cagayan, and the northern portion of Isabela (Quirino, Mallig, Quezon, Delfin Albano, Tumauni, Maconacon, San Pablo, Santa Maria, Cabagan, Santo Tomas, Roxas, and San Manuel).

Emong has been enhancing the southwest monsoon, which will bring strong to gale-force gusts across Central Luzon, Metro Manila, Calabarzon, Bicol Region, Mimaropa, the Visayas, Zamboanga del Norte, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Camiguin, Dinagat Islands, and Davao Oriental.

Both Emong and the southwest monsoon will bring heavy rains over Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya, Nueva Ecija, Batanes, Cagayan, Apayao, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Kalinga, Zambales, Ilocos Sur, Ilocos Norte, La Union, Pangasinan, Abra, Benguet, Metro Manila, Bulacan, Rizal, Quezon, Aurora, Quirino, Oriental Mindoro, Palawan, Marinduque, Romblon, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Albay, Antique, Bataan,

Pampanga, Cavite, Batangas, Tarlac, Laguna, and Occidental Mindoro.

A gale warning is still in effect over the seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon.

The Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) said Emong will continue to weaken and likely exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility on Saturday. (PNA)

DOT suspends tourism activities, closes sites amid heavy rains



MANILA – The Department of Tourism (DOT) has temporarily closed several tourist sites and suspended tourism activities in various regions due to persistent monsoon rains and Severe Tropical Storm Emong (international name Co-May).

In an advisory issued Friday, the DOT urged tourists and tourism stakeholders to prioritize safety, remain vigilant, and follow the guidance of both national and local authorities.

As of 5 p.m. Thursday, the following regions have reported suspended activities or temporary closures of tourism sites:

National Capital Region (NCR)
--Closure of People's Park and Nature Park in Caloocan, Tagalog Eco-Tourism Park in Valenzuela, and select museums in Pasig, Makati, and San Juan.
--Intramuros walking tours and cultural exhibits are suspended.
Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR)
--Closure of tourist destinations in Benguet (Atok, Kapangan, Itogon, Kabayan, La Trinidad), Baguio City (all parks except Burnham), Sagada (Sumaguing Cave, Echo Valley, Kiltapan), Ifugao (Banaue heritage sites), ecoparks in Kalinga and Apayao, and Abra (towns of Tubo and Lagayan).
--Caving, trekking, rafting, and heritage tours suspended; group tours canceled or rerouted.
Ilocos Region
--Closures in Patar Beach, Bolinao Falls, and Hundred Islands in Pangasinan; Tangadan Falls in La Union; and Pinsal Falls and the musical fountain in Vigan.
--All water-based and outdoor tourism activities suspended.

Cagayan Valley

--Coastal areas in Batanes and Nagtipunan ecotourism sites in Quirino are closed.
--The Santo Domingo Bridge in Santiago City is inaccessible.
--Inland trekking and small vessel operations are suspended.

Central Luzon
--Eco-tourism sites in Aurora are inaccessible, and flooding has affected tourism zones in Bulacan and Pampanga.
--Nature-based activities and scheduled tourism training events are suspended.

Calabarzon
--Sites closed include Calibato Falls and Lagalas Falls in Laguna; Hinulugang Taktak and Daranak Falls in Rizal; the Aguinaldo Shrine and Silang cafes and inns in Cavite; and resorts in Lobo and San Juan, Batangas.
--Inland water, adventure, and heritage activities suspended.
Mimaropa
--Island tours in El Nido and Coron suspended; limited access in Puerto Galera; coastal tourism zones affected in Sablayan and Abra de Ilog (Occidental Mindoro).
--Island hopping, snorkeling, and sea excursions are suspended.
Bicol
--Albay Wildlife Park, hill and cave sites in Camalig, and coastal towns in Masbate are closed or under red alert.
--Volcano and beach tourism suspended; ferry operations halted.
Western Visayas
--Mag-aso Falls in Kabankalan and Pamandayan Viewing Site in Antique are inaccessible.
--Hiking and waterfall tours are suspended.

Central Visayas
--No confirmed closures, but multiple areas are under monitoring.
--Outdoor activities suspended in response to local alerts.

Eastern Visayas
--No formal closures reported.
--Boat/ship travel across ports suspended; Tacloban flights canceled.
--DOT-Region 8 Office is coordinating with local government units (LGUs) to assess site access and advises avoiding low-lying and landslide-prone areas.

Zamboanga Peninsula
--No closures reported. Island hopping and dive tours discouraged.

Northern Mindanao
--No confirmed closures. Advisories issued against trekking and visits to waterfalls.

Davao Region
--No formal closures reported. Tree-top and river activities temporarily paused due to landslide risks in elevated resort areas.

Soccsksargen
--No closures reported. Swimming and diving activities discouraged.
Caraga
--No closures reported. Local tourism groups advised to remain alert and responsive to LGU advisories.

The DOT said it will coordinate with its regional offices, LGUs, the Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines, the Philippine Coast Guard, and other national agencies to ensure a unified and timely response to disruptions caused by the weather. TYPHOON EMONG BATTERS PANGASINAN: PROXY PLUS HOTEL STEPS UP FOR ALAMINOS RESIDENTS AND TRAVELERS



ALAMINOS CITY, PANGASINAN — As of 5:00 PM today, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) reported that the center of Typhoon Emong was located over the coastal waters of Burgos, Pangasinan. Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal No. 4 has been officially raised in several areas of the northwestern portion of Pangasinan, including Alaminos City, as the typhoon continues to sweep across the region with dangerous intensify.

Death toll from severe weather conditions rises to 25

MANILA – The death toll from the combined effects of the enhanced southwest monsoon and the onslaught of tropical cyclones Crising, Dante, and Emong has climbed to 25, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) reported Friday. Of the total, three have been confirmed – one each in Central Luzon, Northern Mindanao, and the Caraga region. The remaining 22 fatalities are being verified – nine in the National Capital Region; three each in Calabarzon, Negros Island Region, and Western Visayas; two in Northern Mindanao; and one each in Mimaropa and Davao region. Meanwhile, affected families are placed at 1,065,779, consisting of 3,849,624 residents living in 4,255 barangays in 17 regions.

As of this time, 47,522 families are taking shelter in 1,226 evacuation centers, while 27,685 families have taken refuge with relatives or friends. The disaster response body also said 2,433 houses have been “partially damaged” and 486

have been “totally damaged.”

Meanwhile, agricultural and infrastructure damage was estimated at PHP366.9 million and PHP3.98 billion, respectively. (PNA)

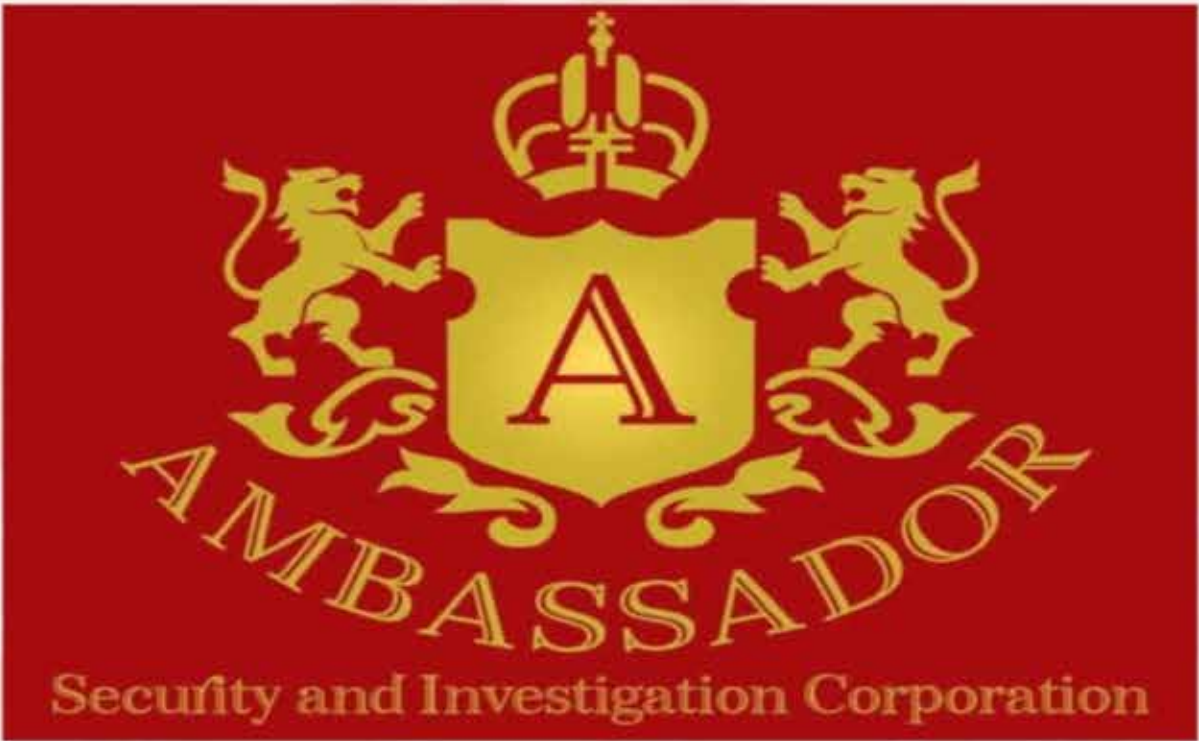
