

DSWD assists 1.8M individuals in crisis situations across Calabarzon

Over 1.8 million Calabarzon residents have received financial aid from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) since 2024 under its Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS).

The program aligns with the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to ensure the swift and efficient delivery of aid, reaffirming the "Bawat Buhay Mahalaga" vision of Bagong Pilipinas.

According to DSWD Calabarzon, a total of 1,833,996 individuals have been provided with financial support since 2024 to help them cope with various economic shocks such as illness, hospitalization, or the death of a family member. Of this number, 587,000 individuals were assisted in the first half of 2025.

"If there's death in the family or hospitalization, you can't prepare for it, so we are helping them get back on track and recover. With the assistance that we give, it will help them be productive, start anew, and provide again for their needs," said Regional Director Barry Chua of DSWD Calabarzon.

DSWD emphasized that the provision of financial assistance under the program is based on the assessment and interview conducted by social workers, as well as the status of the clients.

One of the AICS beneficiaries, Donna Talucod, 43, a resident of Victoria, Laguna, whose husband is a kidney transplant patient, expressed gratitude to the government for the help provided by the program.

"The assistance I received through GL helped me ease the financial burden on my shoulders, and getting the medicines at the nearest Mercury Drug assured me of quality medicine. This is such a big help," Talucod said.

Chua reaffirmed DSWD Calabarzon's commitment to assisting individuals and families through its social protection programs, underscoring the agency's goal to uplift those in crisis situations. (KA, PIA4A)

More CALABARZON towns under state of calamity



Four more local government units (LGUs) in CALABAR-ZON have been placed under a state of calamity as torrential rains continue from the enhanced Southwest Monsoon or Habagat.

Declared under calamity state are the towns of Agoncillo, Batangas as well as Cainta, Rodriguez, and San Mateo in Rizal Province.

The provincial government of Cavite said it will use its Php 15 million-Quick Response

Fund to ensure aid for displaces families. Provincial officials on Tuesday had placed Cavite under state of calamity.

In Cainta, the Sangguniang Panlungsod approved its Resolution No. 2025-012 to formalize the calamity declaration due to the effects of Severe Tropical Storm Crising and the southwest monsoon. Local authorities have reported that the extreme weather has displaced families and disrupted the delivery of essential services in seven barangays. (PIA4A)





The DSWD Calabarzon said it has been monitoring and assessing the situation since the onset of severe weather conditions on Saturday, July 19.

"Since July 19, the DSWD Field Office IV-A, through its Quick Response Teams, has been closely coordinating with local government units (LGUs) to assess the needs of affected families, especially those displaced and currently staying in LGU-run evacuation centers," the agency said.

Aid were also extended in Batangas; Silang, Magallanes, and Ternate in Cavite; Cabuyao City in Laguna; Pitogo in Quezon; and Rodriguez and Taytay in Rizal.

The agency emphasized that it remains ready to provide appropriate augmentation support to LGUs in need of assistance.

"The DSWD continues to coordinate with all affected LGUs in CALABARZON to determine the needs of affected families and deliver the appropriate assistance."

Sufficient food and nonfood items prepositioned in 69 warehouses across the region are ready for deployment to LGUs requesting support.

In addition to distributing Laurel and Tanauan City in relief goods, DSWD personnel also conduct monitoring and inspections of open evacuation centers in the region to ensure the safety of affected families and to address their immediate needs. (KA, PIA4A)


'Emong' continues to weaken; Signal No. 3 still up in N. Luzon

MANILA - Severe Tropical Storm Emong continues to weaken, packing maximum sustained winds of 95 kph near the center, and gustiness of up to 160 kph, the weather bureau said in its 11 a.m. bulletin on Friday.

It was located in the vicinity of Calanasan, Apayao province as of 10 a.m.

Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal No. 3 is still hoisted over the northeastern portion of Ilocos Norte (Bangui, Pagudpud, Dumalneg, Piddig, Vintar, Adams, and Carasi), the northern portion of Apayao (Calanasan and Luna), and the northwestern portion of mainland Cagayan (Santa Praxedes, Claveria Sanchez-Mira, and Pamplona). Storm-force winds will prevail in these areas.

Gale-force winds will be experienced in areas under Signal No. 2: the rest of Ilocos Norte, the northern portion of Ilocos Sur (Santa, Caoayan, City of Vigan, Bantay, Santa Catalina, San Vicente, Santo Domingo, San Ildefonso, Magsingal, San Juan, Cabugao, and Sinait), the rest of Apayao, the northern portion of Abra (Pidigan, San Juan, Tayum, Langiden, Sallapadan, Lagangilang, Danglas, La Paz, Licuan-Baay, Tineg, Malibcong, Peñarrubia, San Isidro, San Quintin, Dolores, Lagayan, Bangued, Bucay, and Lacub), Batanes, and the northern and western portion of mainland Cagayan (Piat, Camalaniugan, Tuao, Buguey, Aparri, Allacapan, Rizal, Lasam, Ballesteros, Abulug, and Santo Niño).



Areas under Signal No. 1 will experience strong winds: the rest of Ilocos Sur, the northern portion of La Union (Luna, Santol, City of San Fernando, San Juan, Bagulin, Bangar, San Gabriel, Bacnotan, Sudipen, and Balaoan), the rest of Abra, the northern portion of Benguet (Mankayan, Kapangan, Atok, Kabayan, Kibungan, Bakun, and Buguias), Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, the rest of mainland Cagayan, and the northern portion of Isabela (Quirino, Mallig, Quezon, Delfin Albano, Tumauini, Maconacon, San Pablo, Santa Maria, Cabagan, Santo Tomas, Roxas, and San Manuel).

Emong has been enhancing the southwest monsoon, which will bring strong to gale-force gusts across Central Luzon, Metro Manila, Calabarzon, Bicol Region, Mimaropa, the Visayas, Zamboanga del Norte, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Camiguin, Dinagat Islands, and Davao Oriental.



DOT suspends tourism activities, closes sites amid heavy rains



MANILA - The Department of Tourism (DOT) has temporarily closed several tourist sites and suspended tourism activities in various regions due to persistent monsoon rains and Severe Tropical Storm Emong (international name Co-May).

In an advisory issued Friday, the DOT urged tourists and tourism stakeholders to prioritize safety, remain vigilant, and follow the guidance of both national and local authorities.

As of 5 p.m. Thursday, the following regions have reported suspended activities or temporary closures of tourism sites:

National Capital Region (NCR) --Closure of People's Park and Nature Park in Caloocan, Tagalag Eco-Tourism Park in Valenzuela, and select museums in Pasig, Makati, and San Juan.

--Intramuros walking tours and cultural exhibits are suspended. Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR)

--Closure of tourist destinations in Benguet (Atok, Kapangan, Itogon, Kabayan, La Trinidad), Baguio City (all parks except Burnham), Sagada (Sumaguing Cave, Echo Valley, Kiltepan), Ifugao (Banaue heritage sites), ecoparks in Kalinga and Apayao, and Abra (towns of Tubo and Lagayan).

--Caving, trekking, rafting, and heritage tours suspended; group tours canceled or rerouted.

Ilocos Region -- Closures in Patar Beach, Bo-

linao Falls, and Hundred Islands in Pangasinan; Tangadan Falls in La Union; and Pinsal Falls and the musical fountain in Vigan. --All water-based and outdoor tourism activities suspended.

Cagayan Valley

-- Coastal areas in Batanes and

Nagtipunan ecotourism sites in

Quirino are closed.

--The Santo Domingo Bridge in Santiago City is inaccessible. --Inland trekking and small vessel operations are suspend-

Central Luzon

--Eco-tourism sites in Aurora are inaccessible, and flooding has affected tourism zones in Bulacan and Pampanga.

--Nature-based activities and scheduled tourism training events are suspended.

Calabarzon

--Sites closed include Calibato Falls and Lagalas Falls in Laguna; Hinulugang Taktak and Daranak Falls in Rizal; the cafés and inns in Cavite; and resorts in Lobo and San Juan, Batangas.

--Inland water, adventure, and heritage activities suspended. Mimaropa

--Island tours in El Nido and Coron suspended; limited access in Puerto Galera; coastal tourism zones affected in Sablayan and Abra de llog (Occidental Mindoro).

--Island hopping, snorkeling, and sea excursions are suspended.

--Albay Wildlife Park, hill and cave sites in Camalig, and coastal towns in Masbate are closed or under red alert.

--Volcano and beach tourism suspended; ferry operations halted.

Western Visayas

--Mag-aso Falls in Kabankalan and Pamandayan Viewing Site in Antique are inaccessible.

--Hiking and waterfall tours are suspended.

--No confirmed closures, but multiple areas are under monitoring.

--Outdoor activities suspended in response to local alerts.

Eastern Visayas

--No formal closures reported.

--Boat/ship travel across ports suspended; Tacloban flights canceled.

-- DOT-Region 8 Office is coordinating with local government units (LGUs) to assess site access and advises avoiding low-lying and landslide-prone areas.

Zamboanga Peninsula

-- No closures reported. Island hopping and dive tours discouraged.

Northern Mindanao

-- No confirmed closures. Advisories issued against trekking and visits to waterfalls.

Davao Region

-- No formal closures reported. Tree-top and river activities temporarily paused due to landslide risks in elevated resort areas.

Death toll from severe weather conditions rises to 25

MANILA – The death toll from the combined effects of the enhanced southwest monsoon and the onslaught of tropical cyclones Crising, Dante, and Emong has climbed to 25, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) reported Friday.

Of the total, three have been confirmed – one each in Central Luzon, Northern Mindanao, and the Caraga region.

The remaining 22 fatalities are being verified – nine in the National Capital Region; three each in Calabarzon, Negros Island Region, and Western Visayas; two in Northern Mindanao; and one each in Mimaropa and Davao region.

Meanwhile, affected families are placed at 1,065,779, consisting of 3,849,624 residents living in 4,255 barangays in 17 regions.

As of this time, 47,522 families are taking shelter in 1,226 evacuation centers, while 27,685 families have taken refuge with relatives or friends.

The disaster response body also said 2,433 houses have been "partially damaged" and 486

have been "totally damaged."

Meanwhile, agricultural and infrastructure damage was estimated at PHP366.9 million and PHP3.98 billion, respectively. (PNA)

6 transmission lines down in northern Luzon due to 'Emong

MANILA – Six transmission lines in Northern Luzon are unavailable as of 9 a.m. Friday due to the effects of Typhoon Emong (international name Co-May).

The National Grid Corp. of the Philippines (NGCP), in an advisory, said these are the Labrador-Bolinao 69-kilovolt (kV) line, which became unavailable at about 12:20 a.m., affecting customers of the Central Pangasinan Electric Cooperative (CENPELCO) and Pangasinan 1 Electric Cooperative (PANELCO 1).

The Bauang-San Fabian 69kV line became unavailable at about 1:01 a.m., and the Bauang-Naguilian 69kV line went down at about 1:52 a.m., affecting customers of the La Union Electric Cooperative (LUEL-CO).

The Bauang-San Fernando 115kV line also encountered a problem at about 1:41 a.m., while the Bacnotan-Bulala 69kV line became unavailable at about 2:34 a.m., affecting LUELCO customers.

A 230kV line is also unavailable but NGCP did not give specific details.

The power transmission operator said "inspection and restoration of lines in the affected areas will be in full swing once the weather allows."

"Please note that loss of power may be caused by affected transmission facilities of NGCP or distribution facilities of local distribution utilities or electric cooperatives. Specific cities and municipalities affected by the power interruptions are determined by concerned Distribution Utilities, unless the outage affects the entire franchise area," it added.

Based on the 8 a.m. bulletin of the weather bureau, Emong has weakened into a severe tropical storm as it passes the Cordillera region.

Its center was last estimated in San Isidro, Abra, moving north-northeastward at 25 kph. Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal No. 3 is currently raised over Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, the northern portion of La Union (Bangar, Sudipen, Balaoan, Luna, Santol, Bacnotan, San Gabriel, Bagulin, San Juan, and City of San Fernando), Apayao, Abra, the western portion of Kalinga (Balbalan, Pasil, Tinglayan, and Lubuagan), the western portion of Mountain Province (Besao, Tadian, Sagada, Bauko, Sabangan, Bontoc, and Sadanga), the northwestern portion of Benguet (Mankayan, Bakun, Kibungan, and Kapangan), and the northern and western portions of Cagayan (Santa Praxedes, Claveria, Sanchez-Mira, Pamplona, Abulug, Ballesteros, Rizal, Lasam, Allacapan, and Aparri).

Signal No. 2, meanwhile, has been issued for Batanes, the rest of mainland Cagayan, including Babuyan Islands, the northbela (Cordon, City of Santiago, Ramon, San Isidro, Alicia, San Mateo, Cabatuan, San Manuel, Luna, Aurora, Burgos, Roxas, Quirino, Mallig, Delfin Albano, Quezon, Cabagan, Santa Maria, San Pablo, Maconacon, Santo Tomas, Tumauini, Gamu, Ilagan City, City of Cauayan, Reina Mercedes, and Naguilian), the northwestern portion of Quirino (Diffun), the western and central portions of Nueva Vizcaya (Kayapa, Santa Fe, Ambaguio, Aritao, Bambang, Bayombong, Villaverde, Solano, Bagabag, Dupax del Sur, Dupax del Norte, Kasibu, Quezon, and Diadi), the rest of Kalinga, the rest of Mountain Province, Ifugao, the rest of Benguet, the rest of La Union, and the northwestern portion of Pangasinan (Bolinao and Anda).

Brgy coordination vital in curbing drug-related crimes — PNP Calabarzon



The Police Regional Office (PRO) Calabarzon has identified community-level coordination as a vital component in curbing drug-related crimes.

In an interview during the Philippine Information Agency's program, Philippine National Police Calabarzon Director, Brig. Gen. Jack L Wanky emphasized that collaboration at the grassroots level, particularly with barangays is crucial in preventing drug-related offenses and deterring the spread of illegal drugs.

"Arrests alone shouldn't be the basis for saying we're controlling the illegal drug situation. What's more important is strong coordination with barangays, so we can immediately monitor communities and directly ensure former drug users and pushers are not returning to their old ways," he stated. The police director also pointed out that the past administration provided records of drug users and pushers, which, with barangay support, can be used for further verification and monitoring.

He added: "We will continue our current strategy, which focuses on both demand reduction and supply reduction. In terms of supply reduction, this involves the intensified operation of our police force. Our directive is, we must not allow our force to be outdone. If they are active, we must be even He then urged the public to more active in apprehending them."

To promote transparency and ensure a humane approach in police operations, Wanky said police personnel must undergo comprehensive human rights training and adhere to estab-

lished protocols to ensure that their actions are lawful.

The regional chief stated that this initiative is part of their strategy to combat drug-related crimes in the region. He also reiterated the importance of grassroots-level coordination, aligning with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s strong stance against illegal drugs a recalibrated, compassionate, and bloodless approach that emphasizes both progress and humane enforcement.

Flood-hit families find relief from PBBM's visit, gov't aid



Displaced families who sought shelter from rising floodwaters found temporary relief from various government assistance delivered no less by President Ferdinand Marcos, Jr. on Thursday, July 24.

Laura Surigao and her family left their home last Monday afternoon amid the flooding in their community. Placing her youngest in a banyera (washbasin), she swam her way to the evacuation center using water gallons as a makeshift floatation device. Her eldest pulled the washbasins that carried the youngsters.

Laura recalled, "We left at five in the afternoon, me and my youngest. All we were able to bring were bottles of drinking water and some clothes we were able to pack. The water was too fast for us to be able to bring more."

After swimming from their

home towards Maly Elementary School, Laura and her family found temporary relief as they were welcomed with a warm bowl of lugaw.

"We did not expect that PBBM (President Bongbong Marcos) would show up. We were lining up when they announced that the president was coming. He (the President) was nearly in tears when he shook hands with us."

Laura was one of the 500 families who received family food packs, hygiene kits, sleeping kits, and water filtration kits from the DSWD.

"Thank you so much, Mr. President, for helping us. You took care of us who are now in the evacuation [center]."

For Angelina delos Santos, the food packs and other assistance provided by the national government will go a long way for her and the other residents whose livelihood were affected by the typhoon.

"It's great that the local government helped and never left us. I'm thankful that the President came over. I hope that this will continue until we are able to get back on our feet."

San Mateo residents are no strangers to rising water levels during typhoons and habagat. Each family is well-acquainted on the locations of designated evacuation areas that even when they drift apart in confusion, household members will show up once mandatory evacuation is enforced.

Like many residents, Angelina and her family are hoping for long-term solutions on the flooding problem in their town during typhoon season.

"I wish this [flooding] problem in our area can finally be solved. They [the government] know what they should do." (PIA4A)


